


ORANGE REGIONAL MUSEUM

Heritage Adventure

Starting at Robertson Park follow the map and try your best to answers the questions for each heritage site. The trail will take 30 - 40 minutes to complete.

Note for parents: Please ensure children are supervised at all times. When crossing roads please use designated crossing areas.

1. ROBERTSON PARK

Stand in Robertson Park, before 1882 you would be in the middle of a swamp with very wet feet! Over 140 years ago this area was known as Blackman's Swamp.

In the 1880's stunt-man 'Blondin' walked a tightrope from the Carrington Hotel to a very high pole in Robertson Park.

How many steps do you think it might have taken 'Blondin' to cross above the road on his tightrope? _____

Refer back to the map to find the Carrington Hotel. Walk to the hotel and count your steps. Parents please supervise children carefully while crossing roads.

2. THE CARRINGTON CLUB HOTEL

This building was built in the mid 1850s by John Peisley. Can you figure out how many years ago this was? _____

It was the first building in Orange to be made of brick. *Now walk across the road with your parents to the Orange Court House [3].*

3. ORANGE COURT HOUSE

Before 1851 the court house was a hut made of slabs of wood and bark.

Using the clues below can you figure out what the roman numerals on the top of the court house might mean?

This is the date the current building started to be constructed.

Clues:

Don't include the VR in the centre and add the numbers together.

MD =1500 - CCC= 300 - L = 50 - XXX= 30 - II= 2




Walk to the top of Byng Street where you can see the Holy Trinity Church.

4. HOLY TRINITY CHURCH

Find this sign (see right), located to the left on the corner of Byng and Anson Streets before crossing to the church. Look at the pictures of the building.

What was missing from the church in 1910?



5. TOWN HALL

Look straight head across the road to the Old Town Hall. It cost 3,800 pounds to build the hall. Today that would be over \$600,000. Can you find the date the hall was built?

Clue: Look at the top of the building.

This is where the council met for almost 100 years until the Civic Centre was built.

6. THE SOLDIER'S MEMORIAL HALL

Standing where you are see if you can also find the dates on the Memorial Hall, which is next to the Town hall. This hall commemorates soldiers who fought in WWI that started in 1914 and ended in 1918.

Cross the road towards Town Hall.

7. THE FIRST POWER POLE

Can you find a tall wooden pole. When you find it look up for a sign about half way up the pole. Read the sign.

Why is this wooden pole important?

Cross back over the road and walk down Anson Street towards Summer Street. When you reach Summer Street turn left and walk about half way down the street then look across the road.

8. DALTON BROS/GRACE BROS

See if you can find this building? James Dalton opened this store in 1865 and said that he could 'fit a man out with everything.'

Can you add the modern surrounds to the picture below?

Tip: Add the cars, trees and signs you can see on the street today. Have a look for anything else that is different.


9. ORANGE POST OFFICE

Look at the building next to the Dalton Bros store, this is the Orange Post Office built in 1880.

Have a close look at the columns on the building. Circle the pictures below if you can find a column like it on the post office. These types of columns were first used in Ancient Greece and then used all across the world.



Ionic Column




Doric Column
