DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION (NOT BEING DESIGNATED DEVELOPMENT)

DA 218/2015(3) - 118 LYSTERFIELD ROAD, ORANGE

Notice is hereby given that application has been made to Council seeking to modify development consent DA 218/2015(2).

Subdivision (206 lot residential) and Demolition (existing dwelling and shed)

The modified development seeks to increase lot yield to 206 lots, and reduce the size of 18 allotments.

The proposal will be on land described as Lot 100 DP 1204145, being 118 Lysterfield Road, Orange. The applicant for the proposed development is 118 Lysterfield Pty Ltd. The consent authority is Orange City Council.

The application will be on public exhibition from Friday, 23 April 2021 to Friday, 7 May 2021. During this period, any person may make written submission on this development proposal to Council.

Submissions close at, and must be received by Council by, 5.00 pm on Friday, 7 May 2021.

In inviting submissions, Council advises that:
